## DESCRIPTION OF COURSE

Film Studies is a chronological look at film throughout the ages. This course will expose students to how cinema has evolved over time. The course will aim to highlight key moments or changes in cinema. This class will be a mix of lessons, movie watching, responding to films, and hands-on activities. When the films we watch do not model ideal language and behavior we will use it as an opportunity to discuss why the director, writer, producer, etc. might have made those choices. The aim is to have open discussions about movies.

## STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

Students are required to bring their pencil case, water bottle, and any materials for accommodations (e.g. noise-canceling earbuds). Students may eat and drink simple and mostly healthy food during class.

Once students enter the classroom, they are expected to sit quietly and wait for today's film.
