Teacher's Expectations:

- Wait outside if a class is still in session—do not barge in.
- Bring the following as per the weather conditions-caps (summer time) warm jacket(winter time) Raincoat/umbrellas(raining time)to class and have them ready on your desk.
- Keep personal belongings in your bag and store them in the locker assigned to you.
- Use your agenda to record for assignments and/or reminders.
- Eating during gardening class is strictly prohibited.
- If there are any issues or problems affecting your ability to participate in class, you must communicate with the teacher before class starts (e.g., talk to, email, or write a note) to arrange necessary accommodations.
- Restroom Breaks and Water: Students should use the restroom and fill their water bottles before class begins. No juice / tea allowed.
- Final Week of the Semester: No late or missing work will be accepted one week before the end of the semester to allow sufficient time for grading and submission into Quickschools.
- Students are responsible for keeping track of their grades and missing assignments, and should speak with the teacher about any concerns.

- If you are struggling or need help, it is your responsibility to ask the teacher for assistance or request extended time before the assignment's due date. Last-minute requests may not be accommodated.
- The class will follow the school's 6Ps expectations and students are expected to work to the best of their ability. Every class will be observed and marked on the basis of **6P**.
- Each quarter will include one individual **project**.
- Students will be evaluated on the basis of their contribution in the **Field work**, for example-how actively the student engages in garden tasks and their willingness to try new activities, regardless of the outcome. How well the student works with others, sharing tools, helping peers, and contributing to group tasks. How responsibly they handle gardening tools and how carefully they tend to the plants, including watering and weeding. Check for student's ability to observe changes in the garden, ask questions, and show understanding of basic gardening concepts (e.g., plant growth, soil care). Check for student's creativity in designing garden plots or coming up with solutions to simple gardening challenges (e.g., dealing with pests, finding the best spot for a plant).
- The **Teacher connect** will focus on the student's submissions of worksheets related to the subject/topics covered.
- Students are to respect themselves, each other, and their environment.

The above expectations will be read out in class at the beginning of the academic year and revisited every quarter to ensure the smooth functioning of the classes throughout the year
