


**Tokyo International Progressive School

**DESCRIPTION OF COURSE**

This UNHS course covers American history from the first explorers and their initial contact with the Native Americans, through the colonial era, independence, early struggles, growth, the Civil War and ends with the industrial revolution in full swing as the country is about to embark on the "American Century."



This course attempts to explore the story of America in an unbiased fashion with a multicultural perspective. It also challenges students to form their own opinions on the various social, economic and political movements. The majority of the assigned reading will be done in class so that the teacher is able to explain vocabulary and expand on historical concepts students may be unfamiliar with. Questions are always very welcome!

Materials: America Through The Lens. Chicago, Illinois: National Geographic Learning, 2019. Textbooks are stored as a class set in the classroom.
